Before We Get Started

- We will be referring to the tool as a "video"
- Your tool does NOT need to be a video
- Your tool could be a:
 - Voice recording
 - Slide show
 - Book, binder, or folder
- Many of the options we talk about for "videos" can be applied to other tool formats





Things to Think About

- Do I want 1 video to use for ALL my appointments
- Do I want 1 introduction video that I can use for all appointments and then create additional videos that are appointment specific?
- What do I need/want to say? What do I need/want my doctor to know?
- Do I want to talk/narrate the entire video or have pictures/written information?
- Where do I want to my video to be stored?
- Do I need a backup plan?





How to Start

- Decide what tool I want to make
- Create an introduction to your video
 - Who I am
 - What this video is and why it is important
- Plan out what I want to say
 - How I communicate
 - Personal information
 - Health background
 - How I want my appointment to go





Introducing Your Video

- Introductory message
- Directing them to the content
- Letting the doctor know how important their attention is
- Purpose of the video





How I Communicate

- What are my communication strategies?
- How do I want the doctor to proceed if I am having trouble communicating?
 - Do I need a break and how to come back to the topic?
 - Do I want my communication partner to support me?
- What do I need the doctor to do during our conversation?





Personal Information

- Name/pronouns
- Date of birth
- Important diagnoses
- Values/preferences





Health Background

- What MUST all doctors know about me and my body?
 - Allergies? Seizures? Reactions?
- What do I NEED the doctor to know right away?
- Medications, previous healthcare, etc.
- What are ongoing concerns that I have about my healthcare?
- Other information that is general to my health





How I Want My Appointment to Go

- What do I expect to get out of my appointment?
- Reiterate how I want the doctor to communicate with me
- Additional instructions/requests for the doctor
 - Emails, texts, etc. for follow up
 - Use of patient portals
- Share with your doctor:
 - Need to Know document
 - Advance directive





SHARE Approach: The Patient

The SHARE Approach

5 Essential Steps of Shared Decision Making

0

Start every conversation by telling your doctor why you are there

2

Help them understand who you are, how you communicate and what is important 3


Ask your doctor questions about your health and the steps you might take

4

Receive advice and discuss your options 5

Evaluate the advice and make an informed decision

 - Combination?










Recording Platforms

Filming Yourself on the iPad

- Screen recording
 - Putting it in your Control Center
 - Will I see my button press?







Uploading Your Files


